



## ONLINE UNDERGRADUATE COURSES IN GASTROENTEROLOGY AND ENDOSCOPY

The Gastroenterology provisions comprises pathways covering Upper GI, Flexible Sigmoidoscopy and Patient Care. The original programmes have been modified in preparation for the 2007/08 intake and commence in September 2007. The programmes can be accessed as full (1 year - 45 weeks) or part time (2 years), with all modules available on a standalone basis as part of continuing professional development.

The programme provides opportunities to develop knowledge and understanding within Gastroenterology with or without endoscopic practice. Students from a variety of backgrounds are encouraged to apply, enhancing the sharing of knowledge and expertise within an inter-professional framework.

The programmes will provide you with a framework for study which;

- Has a high degree of relevance to the field of gastroenterology
- Has significant relevance to students and employers
- Allows for extended learning across professional groups

A variety of teaching methods are used, engaging you in the development of cognitive, affective and psychomotor domain skills and attributes. Each module is delivered online and supported by workshops. Individual modules are assessed in a variety of ways, embracing different learning styles.
