# **Gut Microbiota for Health Expert Panel Charter**

A cross disciplinary education & interest group under the auspices of the British Society of Gastroenterology (BSG Research Committee)

#### **Mission Statement**

- To help increase awareness and understanding among clinicians of the gut microbiota and its impact on health
- To be a 'go-to' resource for UK clinicians (GPs, gastroenterologists, nurses, and allied health professionals) for defining what is currently reliably known in this field
- To drive scientific and clinical interest in the gut microbiota in human disease

# **Objectives**

- To facilitate the sharing of knowledge on the gut microbiota between academics, clinicians and researchers
- To map the science and reach consensus on what is known and what is not yet known
- To draft consensus statements on areas of interest for UK health professionals
- To identify gaps in knowledge and research focus
- To identify R&D areas in this field that would advance understanding and lead to patient benefit
- To develop guidelines to ensure the safe and effective manipulation of the gut microbiotafor therapeutic purposes (e.g. faecal microbiota transplant (FMT) and responsible antibiotic use)

## **Funding**

The panel members meet twice a year. The BSG covers costs for secretariat support. Funding for specific projects is subject to separate agreement.

#### **Current Focus**

- To meet at least twice annually
- To publish an academic review based on the content of the Edinburgh conference (2025) plus other high impact topical reviews in BSG journals\_(e.g. on commercial microbiome testing, the gut microbiota influence on drug efficacy)
- To collaborate with Guts UK on producing educational material about the gut microbiota for clinicians and the general public
- To produce supportive material to help panel members with media enquiries
- To continue to advise on the governance of FMT in the UK, and to continue the FMT consensus panel
- To organise a conference in 2027, and to consider workshops on specific topics
